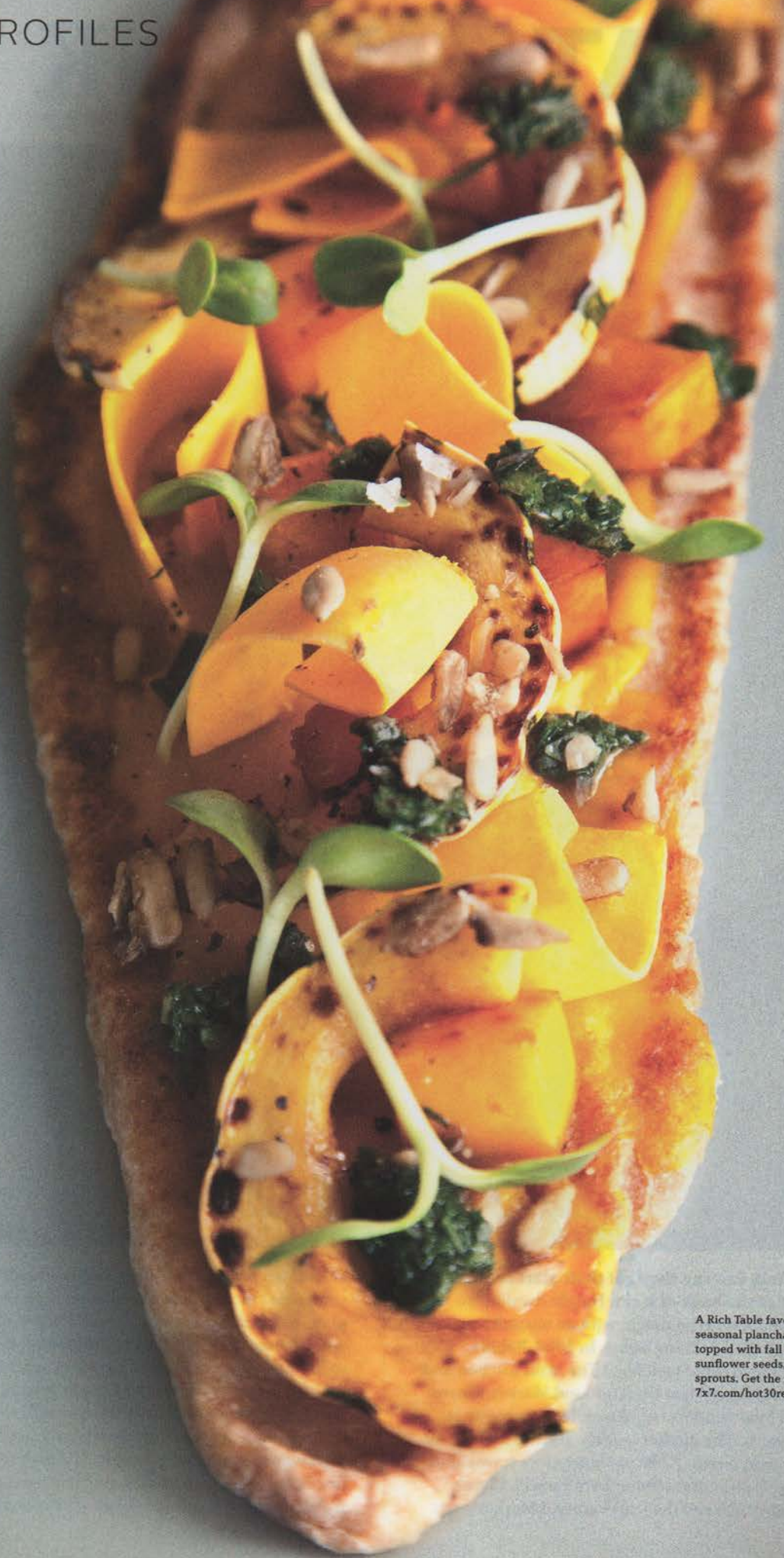

It's a family affair at Rich Table, Hayes Valley's new restaurant that, despite its elegance, feels like the household dining room of wife-and-husband duo Sarah and Evan Rich (she's a native Texan, he's a Jersey boy). The couple, who made a name for themselves with their pop-up Chefs' Night Off, has worked for 10 years in notable New York kitchens—Bouley, Mas (Farmhouse)—and SF restaurants—Michael Mina (her), Quince (him), and Coi (both). But they've always had their hearts set on opening their own place. Dishes at Rich Table are equal parts beauty and flavor bomb, like paper-thin slices of Pacific halibut with pork belly and turnip green purée or buttermilk-poached chicken with corn and pea shoots. —MARCIA GAGLIARDI // **RICH TABLE** (Hayes Valley), richtablesf.com
